PROPOSED CHANGES TO LISMORE LOCALITY BOUNDARIES

The Geographical Names Board is calling for public comment on a proposed amendment to address boundaries between Bentley and Larnook.

Chair of the Geographical Names Board, Des Mooney said Lismore City Council is proposing to amend address boundaries as some properties located on Back Creek Road and Boundary Creek Road in Larnook, gain access to their properties through Bentley.

“Council have confirmed this creating problems with the delivery of services due to difficulty in locating the properties,” Mr Mooney said.

“Under the proposed boundary amendment, the affected properties in Larnook would become residential addresses in Bentley.

“The Geographical Names Board is encouraging community comment before it considers adopting Council’s proposal.”

Residents are invited to view the proposed boundary amendment and lodge submissions with the Geographical Names Board by Monday 8th September 2014.

A map of the Council’s proposal can be viewed at the Lismore City Council Corporate Centre 43 Oliver Avenue, Goonellabah and the Lismore City Library 110 Magellan Street, Lismore” Mr Mooney said.
