PROPOSAL TO ASSIGN LIGHT RAIL STOP NAMES

The Geographical Names Board (GNB) is calling for public comment on a proposal by Transport for NSW (TfNSW) to name 19 light rail stops for the new City and South East Light Rail network.

Railway stations and light rail stops take their names from the suburb they are located in or nearby area of interest.

“Community consultation is an important part of the naming process,” said Mrs Narelle Underwood, Chair of the GNB.

“We want to make sure everyone has an opportunity to provide their feedback on the proposed names,” she said.

The proposed names are:

<i>Circular Quay Light Rail Stop</i>	Located on Alfred Street opposite Circular Quay Railway Station
<i>Bridge Street Light Rail Stop</i>	Located on George Street between Bridge Street and Jamison Street
<i>Wynyard Light Rail Stop</i>	Located on George Street opposite Wynyard Station between Hunter Street and King Street
<i>QVB Light Rail Stop</i>	Located on George Street opposite the Queen Victoria Building between Market Street and Park Street
<i>Town Hall Light Rail Stop</i>	Located on George Street near Town Hall Railway Station between Park Street and Bathurst Street
<i>Chinatown Light Rail Stop</i>	Located on George Street near the intersection with Campbell Street
<i>Haymarket Light Rail Stop</i>	Located at Rawson Place which runs between George Street and Pitt Street
<i>Central Chalmers Street Light Rail Stop</i>	Located on Chalmers Street adjacent to Central Station

<i>Surry Hills Light Rail Stop</i>	Located on Devonshire Street near the intersection with Marlborough Street
<i>Moore Park Light Rail Stop</i>	Located on Anzac Parade near the intersection with Lang Road
<i>Royal Randwick Light Rail Stop</i>	Located on Alison Road near the intersection with Darley Road
<i>Wansey Road Light Rail Stop</i>	Located on Alison Road at the intersection with Wansey Road and Prince Street
<i>UNSW High Street Light Rail Stop</i>	Located on High Street opposite the upper campus of UNSW
<i>Randwick Junction Light Rail Stop</i>	Located on High Street near the intersection with Avoca Street
<i>ES Marks Light Rail Stop</i>	Located on Anzac Parade near the intersection with Carlton Street
<i>Kensington Light Rail Stop</i>	Located on Anzac Parade near the intersection with Todman Avenue
<i>UNSW Anzac Parade Light Rail Stop</i>	Located on Anzac Parade near the lower campus of UNSW
<i>Kingsford Light Rail Stop</i>	Located on Anzac Parade between Meeks Street and Middle Street
<i>Nine Ways Light Rail Stop</i>	Located on Anzac Parade south of Rainbow Street near the Nine Ways roundabout

The closing date for submissions is 11 September 2017. Following this the GNB will review any feedback received.

TfNSW expect the light rail network to commence operation in 2019.
