Proposal to assign reserve names

The Geographical Names Board is calling for public comment on a proposal by Camden Council to name four reserves in Gledswood Hills.

Chair of the Geographical Names Board, Narelle Underwood, said feedback is being sought on the proposal to name the following:

Woodhill Reserve located adjacent to Cullen Circuit and named in commemoration of Joan Mary Woodhill, born in Camden in 1912 and died in 1990. Joan Woodhill made an outstanding contribution to the dietetics profession at a state, national and international level and was appointed OBE in 1973, she was made an honorary life member of the Dietitians Association of Australia in 1983.

Buckingham Park located adjacent to Tarrawarra Avenue. The name commemorates the original name of the property which is now known as Gledswood.

Clover Tree Park located on The Hermitage Way adjacent to Herriot Close. The reserve is named after the Clover Tree which is a regionally significant and vulnerable plant species in Western Sydney.

Brittlewood Reserve is located adjacent to Amberley Street. The reserve is named after the Brittlewood tree which is another regionally significant and vulnerable plant species in Western Sydney.

Mrs Underwood said the board is encouraging community comment before it considers the proposal.

“It is important that place names reflect the character and history of the local area and community,” she said.

“We want to make sure everyone has an opportunity to provide their feedback on the proposed name.”
