How do I view the gazettal date for road names?

You can view the expected gazette date for a road using the below steps

- Log in to the proposal system
- Select manage proposals
- Click view proposal on the desired proposal
- All roads for the selected proposal will be displayed and any road(s) with pending gazette or gazetted will have the date shown within the status bubble as shown in the image below

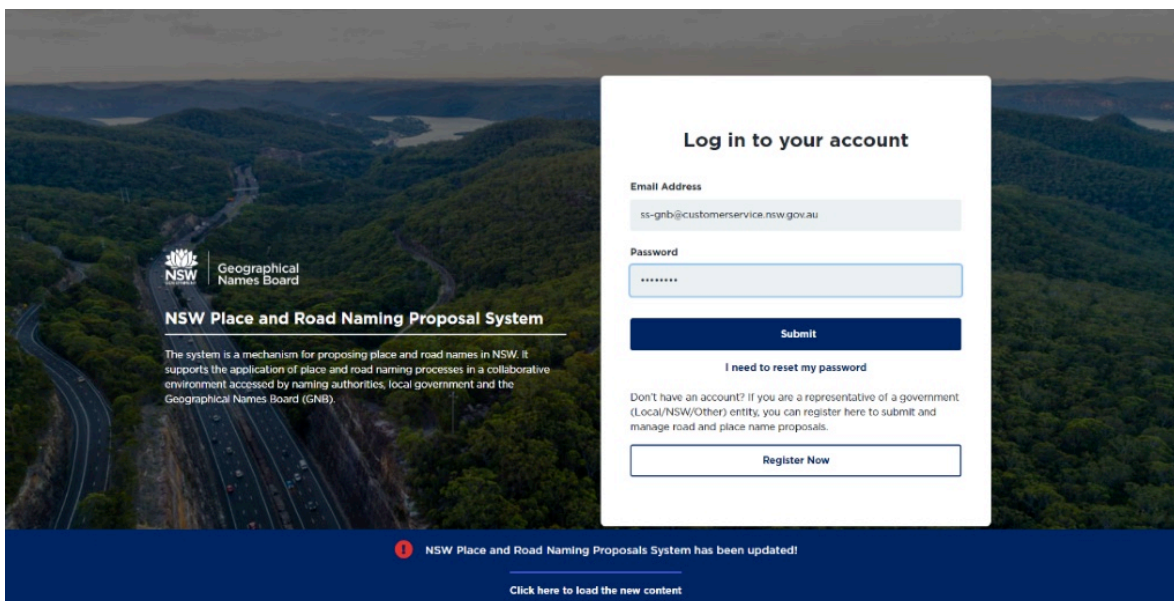

How do I search for existing roads in the new system?

NORNS had the functionality to search for existing road name information within an LGA. The new system currently does not have the same capabilities. As an interim solution, users can access the road name eligibility checker, which can be found [here](#). Currently it has limited functionality. We are working on improving the road name search with a free text function that provides detailed information. We will provide regular updates on the enhancement and appreciate your patience.

What is this banner at the bottom of the screen for?



- Occasionally the Spatial Services IT Department will need to perform software updates to the proposal system. When these updates occur you may see the above banner.
- When you do, you will need to click here to update the browser configuration for the system. The system may not work until you do so. You will also need to log out and log back in when you see this screen.

How do I process multiple road names in the same gazette notice?

The system is designed to create a single gazette notice per road name. Gazette notices are forwarded by email to the Parliamentary Counsel's Office (PCO) from the GNB Secretariat upon approval. We are currently investigating adding a function to process multiple road names in the same gazette notice and will provide updates about this enhancement on our website.

How do I create a proposal for more than one road name?

Currently, you will need to enter multiple road names one by one within the same proposal. If there are many road names the road naming authority can save the proposal as a draft and enter additional road names at a later time before submitting the proposal. Please note - the applicant will be required to upload a map to each road name individually. We are working towards improving this functionality and appreciate your patience on the matter.

What happens to my old road name proposals from NORNS?

Road names that have been proposed in NORNS and are awaiting final gazettal or appeal are being transitioned to the new proposal system as a priority. For assistance with a specific proposal, please contact the GNB Secretariat at ss-gnb@customerservice.nsw.gov.au or call 1800 025 700.

Can I apply for road name pre-approval using the proposal system?

Yes, road naming authorities will now be able to submit pre-approved road names using the new system. For instructions on how to submit road names for pre-approval, refer to page 12 of the [Road Naming User Manual](#). What is a private or non-dedicated road?

A private road is also known as a non-dedicated road. These roads are not maintained by council, do not have to be gazetted, but may be named for addressing purposes and sign posted. Refer to section 6.7.3 of the NSW AUM for further information.

How do I check for an existing road name or if a road name is suitable for use?

To do this, please use the [road name eligibility checker](#) which can be found on the [GNB Road Naming webpage](#).

How do I know if my road name has been evaluated?

- When a road name proposal has been submitted, it will change to a status of proposed and appear on the manage proposals dashboard.
- After the GNB have reviewed a proposal, the status will be updated, and an email will be sent to the road naming applicant as part of the weekly digest.
 - The road naming authority is able to log into the system at anytime to check on the status of a proposal.
- What happens after my road name has been evaluated?
 - After the GNB have reviewed a proposal, the status will be updated, and an email will be sent to the road naming applicant as part of the weekly digest.

- How do I get notified of my organisation's proposals?
 - Road naming authorities will receive a weekly digest of road name proposals from their LGA, detailing the current status of each in-progress proposal.
- How can I gazette existing road names?
 - In NSW there are thousands of road names that have been in use for a long time, and are not gazetted. If council wish to formalise the name via gazettal this should be done outside of the proposal system.
 - The system is a proposal portal for new road names. If any existing road names need to be changed or amended, these should be treated as new road names and proposed through the system. This includes extensions of existing roads.

What Internet Browsers are supported?

The supported browsers are Google Chrome, Mozilla Firefox, Microsoft Edge and Apple Safari.
