## HAVE YOUR SAY ON THE NAME OF TWO CREEKS IN KU-RING-GAI LGA

The Geographical Names Board is seeking community feedback on a proposal by Ku-ring-gai Council to name two creeks.

Chair of the Geographical Names Board Narelle Underwood said community comment is being sought on the proposal to name *Water Dragon Creek* and *Peppermint Creek*.

“It is important that place names reflect the character and history of the local area and community,” she said.

“We want to make sure everyone has an opportunity to provide their feedback on the proposed names.”

*Water Dragon Creek*, a tributary of Lane Cove River, starts at Holmes Street, Turramurra and flows in a south-westerly direction through Twin Creeks Reserve to Lane Cove River in the suburb of South Turramurra. The name is in recognition of the established colony of Eastern Water Dragons that live in and along the watercourse.

*Peppermint Creek* starts at Mitchell Crescent, Warrawee and flows in a south-westerly direction and then south to join the proposed Water Dragon Creek in the suburb of South Turramurra. The name recognises the Peppermint Gums which are common along the creek.
